

Male Childhood Sexual Abuse Program

The Men's Resource Centre provides long term individual and group counselling to men who have experienced childhood and/or adolescent sexual abuse (CSA). The CSA program at the MRC strives to respond concurrently to child sexual abuse and compulsive coping behaviours (such as addictions), recognizing that many compulsive behaviours grow out of the survivors attempts to cope with the pain of the abuse.

The Men's Resource Centre offers education and consultation to Social Services, Business and other community groups on men's issues. The Men's Resource Centre provides a wide range of services to a variety of men in Manitoba. Services are free of charge.

Counselling Services

Counseling services provide men with the opportunity to address issues and to receive support through drop in, individual and group counseling.

Drop-In Counselling

Drop-in counseling is available to men year round. Drop in is offered once a week, on Monday, from 1 – 9 pm. (except holidays).

Individual Counselling

Group Counselling/Workshops

Emergency Shelter

Men experiencing violence within intimate relationships and abuse are eligible for emergency shelter through The Men's Resource Centre Emergency Shelter.
